



Fire Evacuation Update

Although "fire season" is anytime in California that there is no rain; October is around the corner and we are reminded that the two times we were threatened most severely was in October.

We would like to thank those who have responded to the Block Captains, and appreciate all the information and feedback that has been provided so far... However, based on the size of our community, we haven't touched the surface of getting the required information to insure evacuation or the Elfin Forest animals.

We would like to think that everyone that we have not heard from has made plans for evacuation, should the need arise.

If that is not the case, we are still open to

receiving information from anyone who has needs in getting horses and large animals out of the valley. Should you have concerns, questions or need help with the evacuation of your horses, please contact us so we can be prepared to assist you.

After the fire last year, when everyone got back to their homes, it was realized that some residents weren't able to get their horses out of the valley. We don't want that to happen, if there is a next time. We want to keep our community safe, people and animals alike. Currently we are in the process of finding places nearby to transport the horses to.

Last year during the fires and evacuations, people had to move horses to areas where there were not any corrals to put the

horses in. On Fiesta Island for example, people had to keep their horses tied to trailers.

As you know, loading and trailering can be difficult, but if horses don't want to tie, it becomes a compounded problem.

We will be having another horse clinic on Safe Tying Practices. Later this month. Jeff did a tremendous job of showing practical steps to getting horses to load, so we are inviting him back to help in continued safety for evacuation. Please help spread the word!
